Are Chase Points Worth More for Travel?

Yes, Chase points can be worth significantly more when used for travel compared with many other redemption options. The value of Chase Ultimate Rewards® points depends on the Chase credit card you have, how you redeem your points, and whether you transfer them to travel partners.

For many Chase cardholders, points are typically worth between **1 cent and 1.5 cents each** through the Chase TravelSM portal, while transferring points to airline and hotel partners can sometimes provide even greater value—especially for premium flights, international travel, and luxury hotel stays.

For example, 50,000 Chase Ultimate Rewards points may cover approximately \$500 in travel when redeemed at 1 cent per point. However, the same 50,000 points could potentially provide \$750 or more in travel value when transferred strategically to certain airline or hotel loyalty programs.

Understanding how Chase points work is the key to getting the highest possible value.

How Much Are Chase Points Worth?

The value of Chase Ultimate Rewards points depends on your redemption method.

Chase Travel Portal Value

When booking through the Chase Travel portal, your points have a fixed value based on your Chase credit card.

Typical redemption values include:

- **Chase Sapphire Reserve®:** 1.5 cents per point for travel booked through Chase
- **Chase Sapphire Preferred®:** 1.25 cents per point for travel booked through Chase
- **Chase Freedom® cards:** Usually 1 cent per point unless combined with a premium Chase card

For example: +1→888→456→7569

- 20,000 points × 1.5 cents = \$300 in travel value
- 20,000 points × 1.25 cents = \$250 in travel value
